We served the community well with our Children's Center. For fifteen years, crying babies were comforted, toddlers played and danced in a secure and loving space and mothers and fathers were given peace of mind when they kissed their sweet child good-bye at our Center for the day. We served the community well. In addition to loving those sweet babies, we also fell in love with our staff.

A father of one of our children said to me, after a basketball game at which he had refereed Kristian's team, "Pastor, your church is doing good work by caring for those children." His daughter loved to come each morning!

Our Board members worked hard during those years as well. There were challenges and some difficult decisions that needed to be made over the years. The work in God's kingdom is not always easy or without some disagreement on the part of the saints! There was also a lot of laughter and feelings of having served God well in our county.

As you probably are aware, the decision to close our Center was a painful one. It's never easy to see a ministry end in the church. As Christians, we trust that even though we don't know exactly where we are going in the future - we believe that the Holy Spirit goes with us.

My Internship Supervising Pastor was fond of repeating the phrase which he used to wake up his four daughters with every morning: "Opportunity Time!" Often in my year at Cross of Christ in Bellevue, Washington, I would hear Pr. Iver Haugen loudly proclaim: "Opportunity Time!"

Indeed. This is Opportunity Time for the saints of Marin Lutheran Church. On Sunday we voted to accept our Constitution which has these words in it:

The Church is a people created by God in Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, called and sent to bear witness to God's creative, redeeming, and sanctifying activity in the world.

- e. nurture its members in the Word of God so as to grow in faith and hope and love, to see daily life as the primary setting for the exercise of their Christian calling, and to use the gifts of the Spirit for their life together and for their calling in the world.

It's Opportunity Time! Our Council is planning now on a retreat to be held in the early fall to consider how the Spirit is calling us to share our gifts within our congregation, and with our county and world as we step into the future. We will be considering how best to use the space we now have in our church facility - what ministry/ies can take place now? What ministries can we expand upon, what dreams do we need to dream and what old ideas need to be laid to rest? How can we best serve Christ in 2010 and beyond?

These questions will take time. We all need to be patient. Please keep our leaders in your prayers. If you have ideas, dreams or concerns - please share them with a council member.

May God put a blessing upon this time of Opportunity for us as we allow the Spirit to lead the way!

HOW'S YOUR PORTFOLIO DOING THESE DAYS?

During the financial difficulties of the past couple of years, many people kept close tabs on their financial or investment portfolios: real estate, retirement accounts, bank accounts, stocks, bonds. Folks with substantial wealth could - and did - lose significant value in their investments. People of more modest means also suffered losses and kept an eye on their assets, even if they didn't think of themselves as holding them in a "portfolio."

So... how's your portfolio doing? Are you adding or subtracting? Taking inventory or reassessing? Putting more aside for retirement? Are you doing better than a year ago? I hope and pray that this is so!

Stewardship is the way in which we manage the resources and responsibilities entrusted to us. One investment management firm says "Our vision is to help our clients be better stewards of their wealth, so they can achieve their purpose, live their passion and create a legacy that makes a difference." The **purpose** of our stewardship portfolios is to dedicate all that we are, and have, to God's work; our **passion** is to use our resources to reach people and help them to know Jesus; and our **legacy** is the health and vitality of the ministries that we support, both now and beyond our death.

There are some key principles for managing our stewardship portfolios. Grateful generosity undergirds everything that we do, for our loving God has been outrageously generous with us! We are called to give willingly and intentionally from our bounty. We are encouraged to give a uniform portion of our income on a regular basis. We are invited to work to reach a tithe or to stretch beyond. We are asked to be willing to be challenged to give sacrificially. Let's not forget about leaving a legacy! Have you included your congregation in your will? Does your church have an endowment fund, and have you made a contribution? Have you planned a legacy gift by means of insurance, an annuity, a trust or some other method? Are you working with others in the congregation so that they can use your special knowledge or ability in the future?

So... how's your stewardship portfolio doing these days? It's part of God's work. Our hands.

Worship

Join us in worship this summer. Our services are a little more relaxed when it comes to liturgy and time during these months. We are able to do things we don't have time to do the rest of the year. Checkout the Sundays and themes for July and August:

July 4th: God is the source of our nourishment. In the holy eucharist or communion, in the word read and proclaimed, in the assembly of the people of God, the dominion of God has come near. Rejoice! We also give thanks for the freedom's we enjoy on this Independence Day.

July 11th: To love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind is to reflect god's mercy in responding to one's neighbor.

July 18th: Perhaps the church, at its best, is "all ears." Almighty God urges the faithful, again and again, to "listen up!"— to heed the word from above.

August 15th: Mary's role on this Mary, Mother of Our Lord Sunday, is not limited to giving birth to Jesus and mothering him in his childhood. In John's gospel, she is among the women standing near the cross; in Acts, she is among the disciples awaiting the gift of the Spirit.

August 22nd: Remember the sabbath day. Call the Sabbath a delight. This is the Lord's day, and the Lord will do for us what the Lord does; feed us, forgive us, help and heal us. Rejoice at all the wonderful things God is doing. *This will be our summer Hymn Sing Sunday.*

August 29th: Invited and inviting—that is the nature of the church. By God's grace in holy baptism we have a place at the banquet table of the Lord. When, by the power of that same Spirit, humility and mutual love continue among us, the church can be more inviting still.

Social Ministry at MLC

Where are we headed? This is a frequent question we'll hear this summer, as friends and family ask what we'll do with our vacation time. However, in this brief piece, we are actually asking about where social ministry at MLC is headed. And we are encouraging you to give it some thought and share those ideas with members of the Social Concerns Committee at MLC. Hopefully, either July or August will offer you a better chance for some of that reflection than other months.

We wrote earlier about the work of our committee and discussions we were having about the direction of social ministry at MLC. But there are two developments that deserve further consideration. First, after a number of years of contributing to the community through our child care center, we won't be doing so this fall. We are grateful to those MLC members who have devoted so much to this effort and for the relationships that have grown out of the center. It is now critical that MLC devote energy and resources to other needs within the community. What might those needs be? How would they fit into the bigger picture of what we are doing at MLC? Second, the Church Council is planning a retreat for this fall to explore questions like this and other broader questions about the ministry and directions of MLC. The Council would clearly benefit from input from members and friends of MLC.

In closing, we'd encourage you to give all of this some thought. Might even be that you'll identify an area of social ministry that really speaks to you, an area where you'd like to join forces with our committee and contribute to meeting the needs of your neighbors in Marin or those further away. Worship & Music

The last newsletter article explored questions surrounding our approach to worship, specifically pre-worship styles. As there has been much discussion about this issue, I thought it might be instructive to seek comment from the congregation. Many people responded, most on a one-on-one basis, but some took the time to offer written responses. In my unscientific poll, it seems that most people felt that the narthex was the arena of conversation and the sanctuary the arena of worship. (but, certainly, not all!) I'd like to quote a couple eloquent members of the congregation:

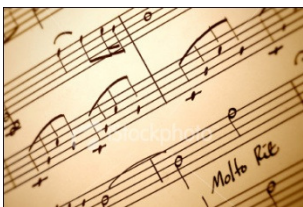
"In some congregations, the narthex has been re-configured (and sometimes enlarged) to be a place of meeting and greeting, where people catch up on the events of the week and make visitors welcome. People get everything settled before they go into the nave. Some even pick up all worship materials (bulletin, hymnals) in the narthex and mark all the hymns in advance. Once worshipers enter the nave, they are quiet and meditative. Sometimes this expectation is reinforced by ushers speaking in soft whispers before they open the doors for worshipers to enter. Those who like to talk until the last minute do so in the narthex, which means there is an influx of people at the end of the prelude. Of course, children do make noise, but contemplative worshipers in these congregations just tune it out."

"There is no "right" or "wrong" way to prepare for worship; rather, there is what works best for the particular congregation. It is important, however, that worshipers have a general understanding of the expected etiquette so that they do not begin worship ticked off at one another. It's common for such expectations to be printed in a "Welcome!" section at the beginning of the bulletin. Others include the information as rubrics (e.g. The prelude is listed, followed by "We enter in silence and prepare our hearts and minds for worship through quiet meditation"). "

"I was raised with a lot of church. I always enjoyed going to the service, Sunday school, seeing my friends there, stealing the sweet rolls during coffee hour. But when I walked into the sanctuary with my family, I knew that was the time to be quiet. My mother always settled herself in the pew, gave me my book or coloring that I had to keep me busy, and then bowed her head in prayer and reflection. She would smile at her friends and whisper something to me or my siblings if it was necessary, but other than that she was preparing for worship. I knew it, and I respected it. My childhood congregation wasn't "high church" I don't think, but it was just what was done and expected. So I guess what I'm trying to say is that is my preference as well. When we enter the sanctuary, I try to keep my children quiet and discourage conversation. This is not always easy! But I do try to teach them that the sanctuary is a place for quiet before the service begins, and if this buys me a few minutes of prayer and reflection, I am grateful."

"I am all for the celebratory, joyful, interactive tone at church in general. Trust me, if I didn't find that at MLC, we wouldn't come. But I do think that we can enjoy each other in the Narthex before the service, in the sanctuary somewhat after the service and then of course around the coffee and goodies outside. For me and my family, I wouldn't mind having a few quiet minutes (if my children allow me!) sitting in the pew before worship begins."

Why don't we continue this interesting discussion?
